

Afterwards we watch Sooty and Sweep on DVD and my grandad always sits in his favourite chair. I love going to his house.








On Saturday mornings my Grandad comes and watches me play football, he said that I have a really good goalie kick.

We are best friends, my Grandad tells me.












My Grandad's new home is really cool and my mum says that he is being really looked after.
